<sup>4</sup>The Design Program moved from CAES to L&S in 2005. Current students have the option to stay in CAES. This report reflects 146 students in CAES and 122 in L&S.

<sup>5</sup> These programs are self-supporting. All other programs are state supported, although several professional programs charge special fees.

<sup>6</sup> Approximately 1,633 of these students are in programs offered off campus, leaving a three quarter average on-campus population of approximately 26,852.
