Existing students can remain in CA&ES or L&S or transfer to CBS. Of the total students, 4,684 have majors in CBS, 172 have majors in CA&ES, and 257 have majors in L&S.

⁴ These programs are self-supporting. All other programs are state supported, although several professional programs charge special fees.
