<sup>1</sup> Of the students in Division of Biological Sciences programs, 1,410 are seeking degrees through the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, and 2,247 are seeking degrees through the College of Letters and Science.

<sup>2</sup> Of the Engineering undergraduates, 406 are seeking a computer science degree through the College of Letters and Science.

<sup>3</sup> An additional 1 postbaccalaureate is counted as a graduate student, increasing the total number of postbaccalaureates to 56 and decreasing graduate students to 3,305.

<sup>4</sup> The Working Professional MBA program is self-supporting. All other programs are state supported, although several professional programs charge special fees.

<sup>5</sup> Approximately 1,602 of these students are in programs offered off campus, leaving a Fall Quarter/Fall Semester population of approximately 25,690.
