¹ Of the students in the Biological Sciences programs, 1,694 are seeking degrees through the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CAES), and 3,398 are seeking degrees through the College of Letters and Science (L&S). The total includes 762 Undeclared Life Science Majors. This major, which was previously reported in L&S, was moved to Biological Sciences in 2003-04.

² Of the Engineering undergraduates, 217 are seeking a computer science degree through the College of Letters and Science.

³ The Design Program was moved from CAES to L&S in 2005. Current students have the option of staying in CAES. This report reflects 161 Design students in CAES and 100 Design students in L&S.

⁴ These programs are self-supporting. All other programs are state supported, although several professional programs charge special fees.

⁵ Approximately 1,683 of these students are in programs offered off campus, leaving a Fall Quarter/Fall Semester population of approximately 27,954.
